

#### Jam'e Masjid Markham Islamic Society of Markham

The Islamic Society of Markham is the first Masjid in the Town of Markham on a 2-acre piece of land at the intersections of Denison St. and Middlefield Rd. The Town of Markham is one of the fastest growing communities in Canada and has approximately 10,000 Muslims living here. Most of the Muslims in this community are first generation immigrants from all over the world, who settled here in the early nineteen eighty's and are primarily professionals and working class people.

Jam'e Masjid Markham has become a focal point for the Muslims of Markham. It is centrally located in the midst of a Muslim community and services the religious, social and recreational needs for this community. The planned Project included a Masjid, Madressah, Multipurpose hall, Library and Dawah centre and facilities for funeral services. The first phase which included the multipurpose hall, were prayers were held at the time, was completed in 2002. The second phase containing the main prayer hall and facilities was completed in 2007.

There are 60 Islamic Centers, 20 Full time Islamic Schools in Greater Toronto, & about 90 Islamic Centers, 30 Full time Islamic Schools, 1 Islamic college in the Ontario.

#### Masjid Fresno Islamic Center of Central California

Masjid Fresno, the Islamic Center of Central California, was first established in 1979, and, through donations from Muslims all over the world, the new building was completed in 1989. This two-story complex offers an open, comforting environment to the community. Masjid Fresno is running a very successful Daawa Program. Many people have reverted to Islam at Masjid Fresno and thousands of people call in and visit to learn more information about Islam every day through an established hotline and website. The Daawa Program has placed ads on eight Fresno city buses to inform our society about Islam. Arabic and Islamic studies classes are held by Sheikh Ramadan, Ph.D., weekly, in addition to Qur'an memorization classes held daily. The muslim community grew from few families and students in the 1970's to about 15,000 now.

Masjid Fresno is one of four Mosques/Islamic centers and 1 full time school, in the city of Fresno, that helps strengthen and expand the Islamic community, which is full of friendly people that set great Islamic examples for all generations.

There are about 260 Mosques/Islamic centers and about 40 full time Islamic schools in California.

### 1908:

#### **Did You Know?**

The first organized "pseudo-Muslim" movement in this country can be traced back to 1913 when Timothy Drew established the Canaanite Temple in Newark, New Jersey. Born in 1886 on a Cherokee reservation in North Carolina, Timothy changed his name to Noble Drew Ali, preached his heavily altered version of Islam, claimed prophet hood, and published the Circle Seven Koran. By 1928, The Moorish Science Temple of America became a well established movement. Although splintered into 3 main factions after Drew's death in 1929, the movement continues until today, but with much less followers.

#### Windsor Mosque Windsor Islamic Association

The Windsor Islamic Association (WIA) has been serving a population of over 30,000 Muslims in the Windsor locality. It started back in 1967 with a small number of Muslim immigrants performing prayers in a small house building. With the large flux of Muslims immigrating to Windsor in the late 1980's, WIA expanded the Masjid into 3 levels, 2 of them allocated for prayer areas, where it holds 1000 worshippers at the current time.

The management of WIA formed a mosque and a full-time private An-Noor Islamic School, established in 1995. It was housed at the An-Noor Mosque site between Dominion Rd and Northwood Ave. The school moved to 1480 Janette Ave in the year 2000. Housing close to 300 students, An-Noor Private School caters for Junior KG to 8th grade. The WIA also houses "Al-Qalam School", a Quranic school aiming at producing generations of Muslims who have memorized and mastered the Quran.



#### **Did You Know?**

Among those associated with the Moorish Science Temple was a peddler named Wallace D. Fard (or Wali Fard Muhammad). In 1930 Fard, who believed to be of Arab origin, founded the "The Lost-Found Nation of Islam in the Wilderness of North America" movement in Detroit to uplift the status of the black race. The movement was later known as Nation of Islam. Fard established the Temple of Islam and the University of Islam in Detroit and told his followers that the original religion of the black person is Islam. Fard disappeared in 1934 and Elijah Muhammad assumed leadership of the movement.

#### **Assalam Center** of Boca Raton

In 1994, few Muslim families started a weekend school to teach their children Islamic Studies and Arabic Language in their homes on rotation bases. The number of students grew and since 1995 the school has been conducted through classrooms at public facilities. In 1996, Assalam Center was officially registered with the State of Florida as a non-profit organization. The Muslim Community of Boca Raton and neighboring cities continued to grow significantly. Hence, in 2000 over two acres land were purchased in the heart of Boca Raton to build the center. The construction was completed and the Assalam Center acquired its certificate of occupancy in the end of March 2008, catering to the Muslim community of Boca Raton and neighboring cities. To protect and preserve the Muslim identity and culture of the children and youth, and assist the families in that endeavor, the center sponsors an Islamic school, prayers, meetings, educational adult and youth forums, annual regional children Quran contest, annual Eid picnics, weekly Halaqa for women, biweekly Halaqa for men, Muslim girl scouts, and many other family events, and strives to project an exemplary image of Muslims to the community of South Florida.

There are 36 Islamic Centers, 8 Full time Islamic Schools in south Florida, & about 120 Islamic Centers, 18 Full time Islamic Schools in Florida.

#### **Did You Know?**

The teachings of Fard and Muhammad were not in harmony with the teachings of mainstream Islam. They taught that the white race is Satan and declared that Elijah Muhammad as the Messenger of God. In September of 1934, Elijah Muhammad moved to Chicago and later to Washington DC. He, along with many other male members of the Nation of Islam, was arrested during War World II for refusing on religious basis to be drafted into the military. Membership of the Nation of Islam reached new heights with the recruitment of Malcolm Little (later known as Malcolm X and finally el-Hajj Malik el-Shabazz).

#### Tempe Masjid Islamic Community Center of Tempe

Tempe Masjid, practically within the campus of Arizona State University (ASU) in Tempe, provides a diverse cosmopolitan milieu welcoming all to worship Allah and practice Islam freely. Community members are composed of more than 75 nationalities and come from various walks of life from highly-cerebral to blue-collar workers. The Masjid's beautiful architecture is modeled after the Dome of the Rock in Jerusalem; the eight-sided structure has a minaret and a gold dome. Prior to establishing the center, Muslims used to gather in local homes or commute to Phoenix mosques for Friday prayers.

Now, the Masjid provides a spectrum of programs and services to the Muslims and the Tempe community at large. It is closely associated with the ASU Muslim Student Association, and operates the Phoenix Metro Islamic School (PMIS), which was established in 1998 and caters for elementary school-age children. Students are educated and nurtured according to the teaching of Islam and get to learn and practice Arabic.

There are 12 Islamic Centers, 2 Full time Islamic Schools in Tempe vicinity, & about 18 Islamic Centers, 3 Full time Islamic Schools in Arizona.

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## Key Events of Islam in America

### 1965:

Published soon after its subject's assassination in February 1965, The Autobiography of Malcolm X tells the story of one man's conversion to Islam in the larger context of the African-American experience. It remains one of the most influential books of the 20th century.

## 1960s-1970s:

Bangladeshi American architect Dr. Fazlur Rahman Khan is regarded as the "Einstein of structural engineering" and considered "the greatest structural engineer of the second half of the 20th century" for his constructions of the Sears Tower and John Hancock Center in Chicago. He also designed the Hajj terminal in Saudi Arabia.

#### Did You Know?

Malcolm X was born on May 19, 1925, Omaha, Nebraska. He joined the Nation of Islam while in prison in 1947. Upon his release in 1952, he traveled to Chicago and met Nation of Islam leader Elijah Muhammad. Malcolm was an eloquent speaker and became the main spokesman for the Nation of Islam. Malcolm separated from Nation of Islam in March 1964 and formed a new organization called Muslim Mosque, Inc. The Hajj (pilgrimage) of April 1964 proved to be a turning point in Malcolm's life. He embraced mainstream Islam and changed his views about the white race. Malcolm was assassinated on February 21, 1965 in New York City.

#### Masjid Al-Huda Islamic Center of Las Cruces

Located in the verdant Mesilla Valley in south-central New Mexico, Las Cruces is a growing community with a bright future. It is the fastest growing city in New Mexico and the 11th fastest in the nation. The Valley has been home to people for at least 4,000 years. The Rio Grande flows through the middle of the valley, with the gorgeous Organ Mountains rising to the east. The surrounding agricultural land yields pecans, onions and other produce, but it is renowned for growing the besttasting green chili in the world.

The Muslim community started back in the mid 1970's and used to pray in a trailer house. In early 1990's and after collecting enough funds, the community decided to build the Masjid. It went through some legal quarrels but finally was completed to serve around 500 regular Muslim worshippers in the city. It has a Sunday school that serves about 45 kids.

There are 2 Islamic Centers in Las Cruces, about 11 in the state as well as 1 full time Islamic School in New Mexico.

## Key Events of Islam in America

#### 1960-1981:

During his professional career, Muhammad Ali joined Nation of Islam in 1964 and embraced mainstream Islam in 1975. He had the honor of lighting the flame at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta, GA. In 1999, he was crowned "Sportsman of the Century" by Sports Illustrated and "Sports Personality of the Century" by the BBC.

#### 1969-1989:

American Muslim NBA player Kareem Abdul-Jabbar is considered one of the greatest players of all time. During his 20-year professional career in the NBA, he scored the highest points total of any player in league history (38,387 points), in addition to winning a record six Most Valuable Player (MVP) awards and six NBA championships.

#### Did You Know?

Warith Deen Mohammed (October 30, 1933 - September 9, 2008) is the reformer of the Nation of Islam and the son of its leader Elijah Muhammad. He assumed the leadership on February 25, 1975 following his father's death. Mohammed brought the organization back in line with traditional Sunni Islam when he rejected the belief that his father was a prophet and the white race is "blue-eyed devil". The name was changed again to the American Muslim Mission in 1978 and to the Muslim American Society in 1985. Mohammed finally resigned his position as the leader of MAS and created "The Mosque Cares".

#### Malcolm Shabazz Masjid

Located in Manhattan with an international congregation, Malcolm Shabazz Masjid is a point of pride for the Muslims of Harlem. The building was originally opened as Temple No. 7 in 1957, led by Nation of Islam's Minister Malcolm X. In 1965, it was firebombed and largely destroyed after the assassination of Malcolm X. When it was reopened in 1969, renovations had introduced the traditional features of middle-eastern architecture such as arches and the aluminum dome, once topped by a golden crescent. In the late 1970's, it was renamed Masjid Malcolm Shabazz honoring its first minister. The mosque is now the center of a lively community that supports the private Sister Clara Muhammad School, a bookstore, restaurants and a range of social services for children, the sick and the elderly.

The mosque's leaders have helped develop an international market in a vacant lot across the street, a contribution to economic revitalization. Additionally, they plan to initiate construction of public housing and housing for the elderly on another corner of the mosque's intersection. Resident Imam Izak-el M. Pasha became the first Muslim chaplain of the New York City Police Department in 1999. He also serves on the Executive Council of Religions for Peace - USA, as a representative of The Mosque Cares/W.D. Mohammed Ministries, which is centered in Chicago.



Louis Farrakhan (born Louis Eugene Walcott on May 11, 1933, in the Bronx, New York) proved to be a pillar in the NOI history. He joined the movement in 1955 and rose through the ranks very quickly. While Mohammed was gradually stirring the ship toward mainstream Islam, Farrakhan decided to revive the teachings of Fard and Elijah Muhammad and formed his group with the original name "Nation of Islam". His ability to galvanize people around him was vividly seen during the Million Man March, October 16, 1995

To accommodate the growing Muslim community in Oklahoma City, an old gymnasium on 5 acres of land was purchased in 1988 for the purpose of constructing a complete and comprehensive Islamic center, a milestone in itself for the Muslim community. Construction was finally completed on the 13<sup>th</sup> of Ramadan in the year 2008 and the Masjid is now offering services to a strong 200 Muslim families with ethnic backgrounds from all over the globe. The association has future plans for the expansion of a school, a community center, and a retirement home.

Located on 3900 NW 39th Street in Oklahoma City next to Masjid An-Nasr, Mercy School, founded in 1999, serves as the Islamic school of Oklahoma City for more than 5000 Muslims. With a professional team of qualified and dedicated Muslim teachers and staff, Mercy School caters to grades Pre-K3 to 6<sup>th</sup>.

There are 6 Islamic Centers, 1 Full time Islamic School in Greater Oklahoma City, & about 15 Islamic Centers, 2 Full time Islamic Schools in Oklahoma.

1991:

1991: Charles Bilal was elected The Islamic Cultural mayor of Kountze, Texas, the first Muslim to head a U.S. municipality

Center in New York City was completed. It is the first building erected as a mosque in New York City.

## 1992:

Imam Warith Deen Mohammed known as "America's Imam," and head of The Mosque Cares was the first Muslim to offer the U.S. Senate's invocation.

#### **Did You Know?**

Though many influential people trace their heritage back to NOI or Ahmadiyya Movement in Islam, a good number left them and followed mainstream Islam. Shaikh Dawud Faisal from Grenada founded Islamic Mission of America, the first mainstream mosque in 1924 in Brooklyn. Professor Ezeldeen studied Islam and Arabic in Egypt and founded the first nation-wide mainstream Islamic organization "United Islamic Communities". First Mus-lim Mosque of Pittsburgh (1932 led by Sheik Nasir Ahmad) along with First Cleveland Mosque (early 1930's led by El-Hajj Wali Akram) are examples of Mosques established by followers of AMI and later reverted to following mainstream Islam.

#### Islamic Center of Hatillo

The Muslim community in Hatillo started back in the 60's with about 100 brothers who used to pray Jumua in rented places until they settled in a shop owned by a Muslim brother for sometime. The community grew more by 1978 but had no sufficient resources to start a Masjid. A piece of land was purchased in 1997, and 2 years later the construction of a Masjid started. The Muslim community in Hatillo largely consists of Palestinians who immigrated early on to Puerto Rico back in the 50's and 60's. 2004 official data estimated there are 6,000 Muslims in Puerto Rico, representing about 12% percent of the population. The early Muslim community largely consisted of Palestinians who arrived between 1958 and 1962. At the time, the vast majority of Puerto Rico's Muslims lived in Río Piedras, a crowded suburb of San Juan, where they operated restaurants, jewelry stores and clothing outlets. In Puerto Rico, about 80% of the Muslim population are Palestinians, 7% Pakistanis, 7% Lebanese, 3% are indigenous Muslims and the other 3% are Egyptians, Moroccans, and other nationalities.

There are 8 Mosques/Islamic centers in Puerto Rico. Four of them (Vega Alta, Hatillo, Ponce, and Fajardo) are major land marks with their elegant domes and minarets.

#### **Did You Know?**

Early 1990's was a milestone in the history of Islam in America when indigenous Muslims and immigrant Muslims were brought closer together when W. D. Muhammad, Jamil al-Amin, the presidents of Islamic Circle of North America and Islamic Society of North America signed the California Islamic Declaration, establishing a National Shura Council to discuss matters of national and international importance and take appropriate collective actions. Early 2000's steps were taken to bridge differences between NOI and the mainstream Muslims. For example, Minister Farrakhan invited W. D. to address NOI congregation on Savior Day, Friday prayer is held in several of NOI Mosques, Ramadan is observed; and Farrakhan speaks out in support of Muslim causes.

#### Masjid Ar Ridwan Al-Khair Islamic Society of Rio Grand Valley

Masjid Al Redwan is located in south Texas with an estimated Muslim population of 150 families in the area. It is one of 5 Mosques/Islamic Centers in south Texas bordering Mexico (McAllen, Edinburg, Brownsville, Laredo, and Weslaco). It is about 230 miles south of San Antonio. Close by Muslim communities are in the cities of Kingsville and Corpus Christi.

The major Muslim concentrations in the state of Texas are in Houston (45 Mosques & 7 Full time schools), Dallas/Fort Worth (45 Mosques & 10 Full time schools). Other cities like Austin and San Antonio have sizable Muslim communities as well. It is intersting to know that Texas has seen an expulsion of the size of the Muslim community in the past 40 years. For instance, Dallas/Fort Worth area has increased from few muslim families in the 1960's to an estimated 100,000 Muslims now.

There are about 130 Mosques/Islamic centers and about 23n full time Islamic schools in Texas.

W. D. Mohammed's strategy to decentralize the movement gave birth from the 1980's till today to autonomous Mosques and community-based imams. "While some of these new leaders and communities trace their Islam back to earlier movements, many came to Islam independent of that history." Among these is Siraj Wahhaj (converted 1969) established Masjid At-Taqwa in Brooklyn, NY, in 1981. Jamil Abdullah Al-Amin (converted early 1970's) established "Imam Jamil Al-Amin's National Community" in 1983. Zaid Shakir (converted 1977), Hamza Yusuf (converted 1977), Suheib Webb (converted 1992) and many other popular American imams.

Khadeeja Masjid **Islamic Society of Greater Salt Lake**

#### Dar Al Hijrah **Islamic Center**

Dar Al Hijrah's inception dates back to 1983 CE/1403 AH. The site of the Masjid off of Route 7 in Falls Church, VA, was chosen due to its accessibility and close proximity to the major suburban regions that constitute the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan area. With approximately 40,000 Muslims residing in the areas that the center serves, Dar Al Hijrah had a strong community from which to establish itself. The center is an active member of McLean Clergy and Arlington Interfaith Council, and in the Interfaith Conference of Washington Metropolitan area.

The original masjid, a house that still exists on the premises, was used for approximately eight years. Construction of the current structure began during 1986, despite seemingly insurmountable obstacles, the new structure was opened on March 2, 1991/Sha'ban 15, 1411.

There are over 20 Islamic Centers, 10 Full time Islamic Schools, 3 Islamic colleges in northern Virginia, & about 70 Islamic Centers, 15 Full time Islamic Schools, 3 Islamic colleges in Virginia.

#### **Did You Know?**

Until the 1980s, you can hardly find a Full time Islamic School other than Sister Clara Muhammad schools in the African American Muslim communities. The sizable growth in the population of the Muslim community and the determination to preserve both Islamic principles and Muslim identity, brought to focus a fourth crucial need: the establishment of full time Islamic Schools. As of today, there are about 330 schools in the USA & Canada.

Muslims' religious objection to dealing with interest-based loans brought to focus a fifth crucial need: the establishment of Islamic financial institutions such as LARIBA and

several American institutions started providing mortgage contracts that adhere to Islamic principles. Two examples of this trend are Devon Bank and Michigan-based University Bank

The concept of brotherhood in Islam coupled with the precept of Zakah further inspirited the Muslims Community. They recognized the need to address the hardships afflicted on Muslims in different parts of the world as well as to stand with those much less fortunate. As the hardships increased, so did charitable organizations. Examples include Islamic Holy Land Foundation and many more.

Guidance. Realizing the potential in the Muslim Community, Since the time of Ellis Island, each new immigrant group has had to face civil and human right challenges. Muslims are no exception. Consequently, from the late 80's and on a handful of civil rights organizations were established such as CAIR and MAS Freedom.

Immigrant Muslims had great impact on the spread of Islam in this country. Some of their organizations originated through graduated members of the Muslim Students Association that was established in 1962 by students on university and college campuses. The Islamic Society of North America (ISNA), Islamic Circle of North America (ICNA) and Relief, Mercy International, Life for Relief and Development, many other religious, social and professional organizations were formed.

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


